On the church calendar, November 30th is the First Sunday of Advent. It's the start of a new church year - the beginning of a cycle which takes us from the birth of the baby Jesus at Christmas, through His death and resurrection in the Lent/Easter season, and then through the summer, when we hear afresh additional exciting stories from the Bible.

The Bible is filled with amazing stories of historical people and events, love interests and hated enemies, stories of miracles and hard work. The Bible includes 66 books devoted to the lives and events of God's people. The Bible must be read and studied over and over again to get the full extent of all it has to offer us, 21st Century Christians.

On Sunday, November 23rd, I am going to bring all the adult Sunday School classes together for a five week study titled *What Do You Want for Christmas?* In this class, we will discuss the stories leading up to the birth narrative of Jesus and how those stories impact our lives. On the First Sunday of Advent, the pre-school, elementary children and youth classes will begin to study the same Bible story each week (with age-appropriate activities). Common Bible stories have been selected to cover the 52 weeks of the year. In this way, the children and youth of Signal Hill will learn the important parts of the Bible and be taught what is true.

If you aren't currently a part of an adult class (or have children or youth who aren't in a class), I hope you'll take the risk of being exposed to the Bible and in a new and exciting way. It just might be the most important change you've ever made in your life.

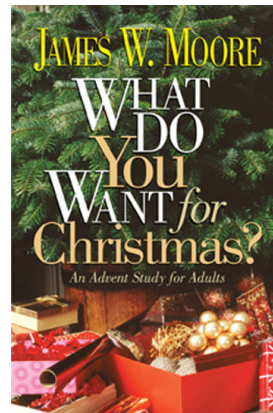

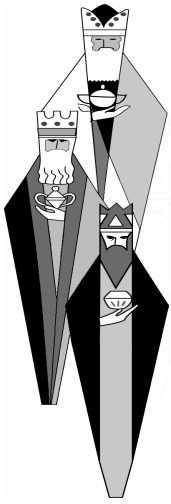
SHUMC to participate in "Holiday on the Boulevard" on Sunday, December 14

Thirteen participate in CROP Walk



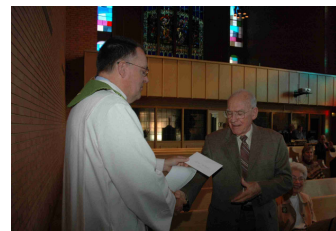
